Human Rights and Gender Equality in Health Sector Strategies. How to Assess Policy Coherence (2011)

Author: World Health Organization

Description: This tool, developed in collaboration between WHO, the Office of the High Commissioner for Human Rights (OHCHR) and the Swedish International Development Cooperation Agency (Sida) is designed to support countries to strengthen national health strategies by applying human rights and gender equality commitments and obligations. The tool poses critical questions to identify gaps and opportunities in the review or reform of health sector strategies. The tool can be useful for different purposes and by different actors. The way it is used will vary, depending on the specific context and focus of the assessment exercise. There are two intended primary uses for the tool:

1. For use by a health sector review team during an annual/mid-term review or planning exercise. A health sector review process often involves many stakeholders who review various aspects of health sector planning and implementation. In this context, elements of the tool can be incorporated into other tools and review exercises. The annual/mid-term health sector review or planning process is usually implemented under the coordination and leadership of the Ministry of Health (MoH),
2. For use by a review team for a specific study aimed at evaluating or assessing a health sector strategy from a human rights and gender equality perspective. The study may be one separate component of an overall health sector review process, or may be independently commissioned by the MoH, an international or national CSO or a development partner.

Description: This good practice guide, based on the experience of a project in India and Bangladesh called Saving Mothers and Children, describes an approach that has the potential to reduce maternal and newborn deaths, and to address other health problems. The project worked through women's groups, using a participatory learning and action cycle, to mobilise community action to improve the health of mothers and babies.

Description: From criminal justice, children services to poverty reduction, this report contains essays from organizations using different methodologies and approaches to generate evidence and influence policy and practice in a number of service areas. The idea that policy and practice should be underpinned by rigorous evidence is internationally accepted, yet there is recognition that the level of rigor in evaluating 'what works' in social policy remains limited. In a time of public service reform and more decentralized decision making, the need for timely, accessible and reliable evidence is becoming ever more important.

Using evidence: Advances and debates in bridging health research and action (2010)

Description: Global health issues, such as access to clean air and water, obesity, poverty and health, cardiovascular disease prevention, and clinical effectiveness, need high quality evidence so that problems can be understood and addressed. There is a widespread belief that research evidence can and should be used more effectively in health-related decision-making – from broad government actions that have an impact on health, to practitioner decisions in clinical and public health practice. A major development in health research over the past 10 years has been the growth in knowledge translation (KT) and the diffusion and use of research.
